





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

### Highlights

**Current Employment.** This year the vast majority of recent alumni are employed (92%). Five percent are not seeking work and less than one percent are in the military. Two percent are unemployed. Four out of ten continue to work for employers they worked for prior to graduating. Among those with new jobs, eight-in-ten attained jobs that require a college degree. Eighty-eight percent of recent alumni say their job is related to their major and ninety-six percent say their IUPUI education enhanced their future prospects. The overall median salary for 1997-98 undergraduate degree recipients is \$30,000 - \$35,000.

**Further Education.** Eight-in-ten recent alumni either are currently enrolled at some institution of higher education or intend to further their education: one fourth are currently enrolled and nearly sixty percent are planning to enroll at some institution of higher education in the future. Half (47%) of those currently furthering their education are doing so at IUPUI. Considering all alumni who received their undergraduate degree during the 1997-98 academic year, one in ten are currently enrolled at IUPUI and another one-half say it is likely they will further their education here. In all, seven of ten recent alumni either are currently attending or say they plan to further their education at IUPUI.

**Impact of IUPUI on Alumni Learning.** Items in the section Impact of IUPUI on Alumni Learning were revised and expanded this spring to better represent the Principles of Undergraduate Learning. These changes appear in both the alumni survey and the continuing student survey. A *Research Brief* to be forthcoming will discuss the results of this section for alumni as well as continuing students.

**Satisfaction with IUPUI Experience.** Again this year alumni indicate they are most satisfied with what they consider to be the most important aspects of their experience here. The quality of education received at IUPUI and the quality of teaching by faculty in their major area continue to rank highest in terms of both importance and satisfaction, followed by courses in the major. Recent alumni are least satisfied with their opportunities to work on faculty research projects, engage in extra-curricular activities, and engage in community service, each of which ranks comparatively low in terms of importance. Academic advising is an important concern for most alumni, but ranks relatively low in terms of satisfaction.

### Changes From Previous Year ([Link to last year's report](#))

**Satisfaction and Importance.** There were no substantive increases in satisfaction or importance (defined as a mean difference

greater than .20 on a five point scale) this year over last. However, there was a statistically significant ( $p < .01$ ) increase in alumni satisfaction with the opportunities to engage in community services (.26 to .35) and with the importance graduates attached to the opportunity to integrate what they've learned with their own personal experience (1.10 to 1.20) on 5-point bipolar scales ranging from  $-2 =$  to  $+2$ .







**How Well IUPUI Education Has Enhanced Future Prospects**








