Welcome to the 2018 IUPUI School of Informatics & Computing Entering Student Survey Report

The Entering Student Survey is a yearly survey administered during the first day of a student's orientation. The students are given the link to the survey during a dedicated block of time to ensure they have enough time to complete the survey. The survey is not required to be filled out, but it is encouraged as some responses may be used to ensure they get information to resources to help them succeed in college. Of the 120 School of Informatics and Computing beginning freshmen direct admits in the 2018 cohort, 67 completed the Entering Student Survey. That is a response rate of 56%. The total number of Informatics and Computing pre-major students was too low to report on or do comparative analysis.

Key Highlights Overall

- Compared to all other **direct-admit students**, School of Informatics & Computing **direct-admit students** were less likely to rate themselves higher than their peers on leadership ability, participate in an internship, co-op, field experience, practicum student teaching, or clinical placement, spend fewer hours preparing for class, and more likely to choose IUPUI because of media (TV, social media, newspapers, commercials, movies) that spark my interest or awareness.
- **96%** of Informatics & Computing direct-admit respondents agree that the IUPUI campus is welcoming.
- **41%** of direct-admit respondents reported that being a hard worker is **'Very much like me'**.
- Informatics & Computing direct-admit respondents rated themselves highest in **'Academic Ability'** with a mean of 3.90 compared to other areas of self-efficacy.
- **46%** of Informatics & Computing direct-admit students plan to spend at least 11 hours **'working for pay on campus'**.
- **72%** of Informatics & Computing direct-admit students have at least Some concerns about financing their college education.
- The top 5 reasons respondents decided to attend IUPUI were 'Cost', 'Availability of financial aid/scholarship', 'Availability of specific academic programs (majors)', 'Job, career, and internship opportunities available in Indianapolis while attending school', and 'Opportunity for an IU or Purdue Degree'.
- For School of Informatics & Computing respondents that have chosen a major, the number one reason they chose their major was because **it aligned with their interests**.

RESPONDENTS

A means comparison analysis was conducted between the 2018 School of Informatics & Computing direct-admit respondents and the all other 2018 beginning freshmen direct-admit respondents who took the Entering Student Survey. For four areas of questions a construct was formed to better analyze differences between the two groups. None of the four constructs were significant at the .05 level.

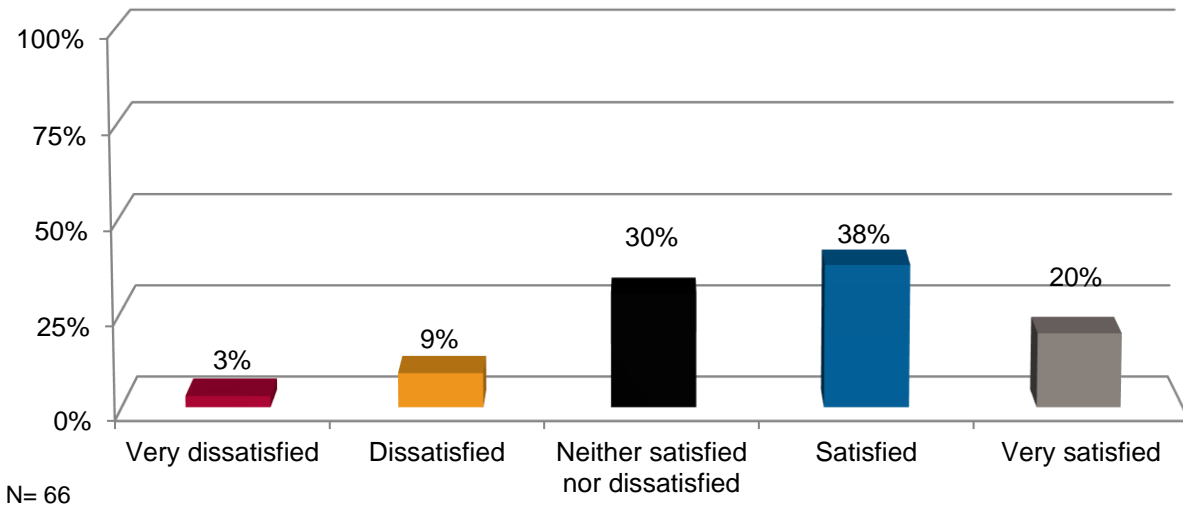

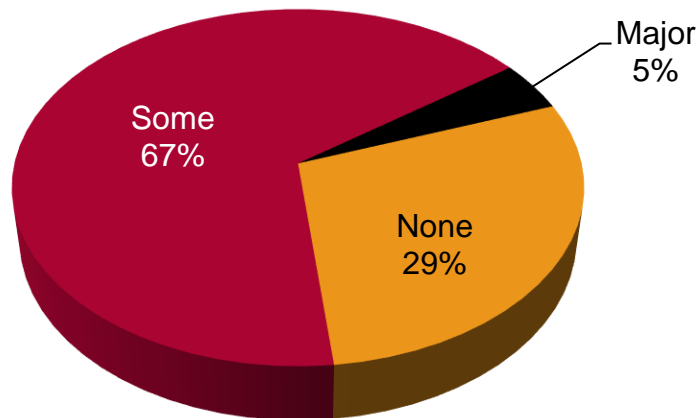

Do you have any concerns about your ability to finance your college education?

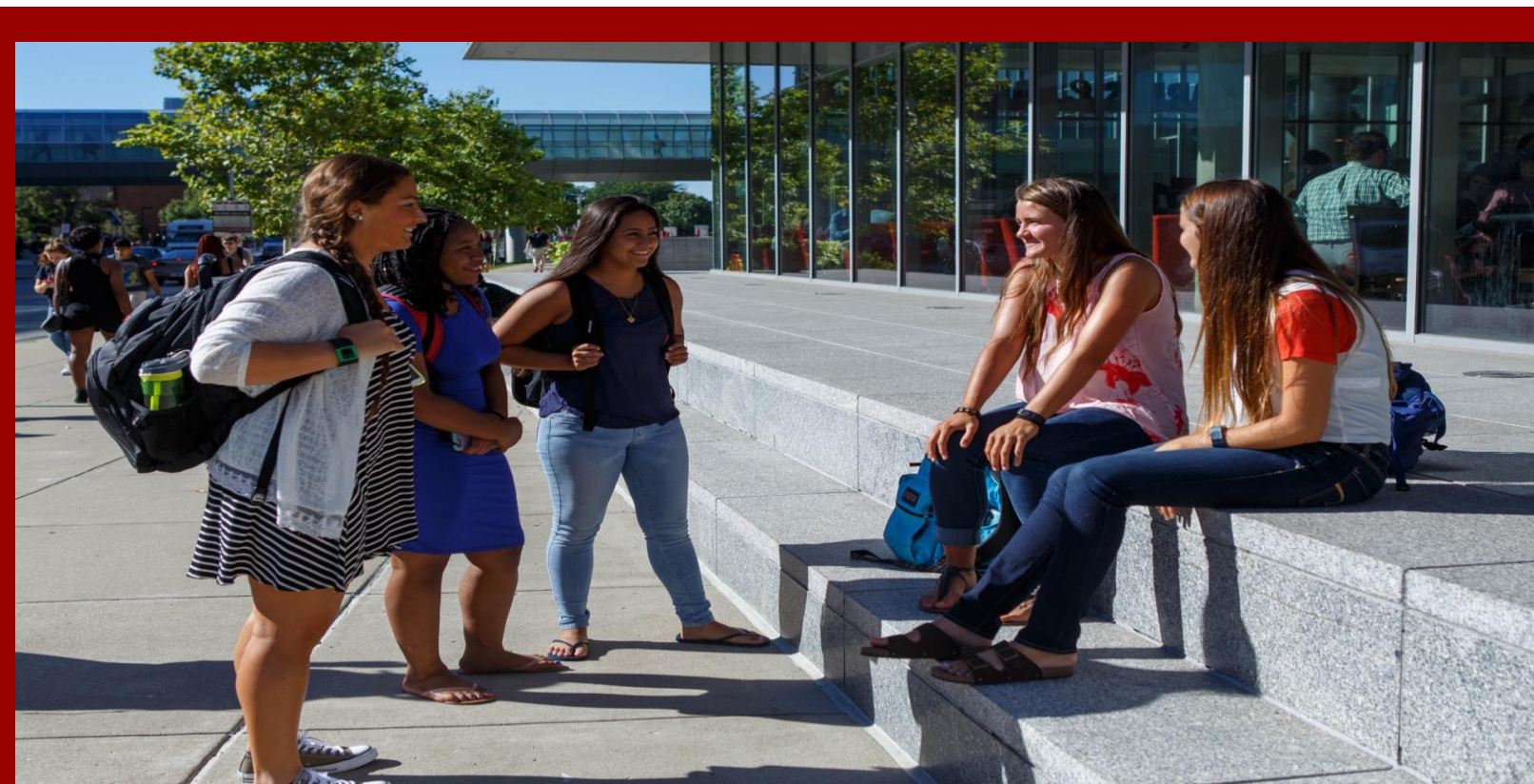

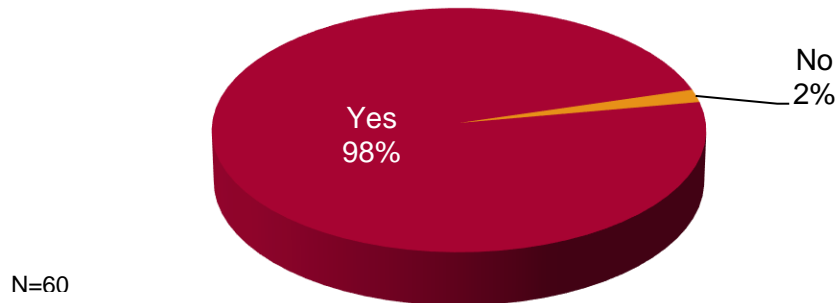

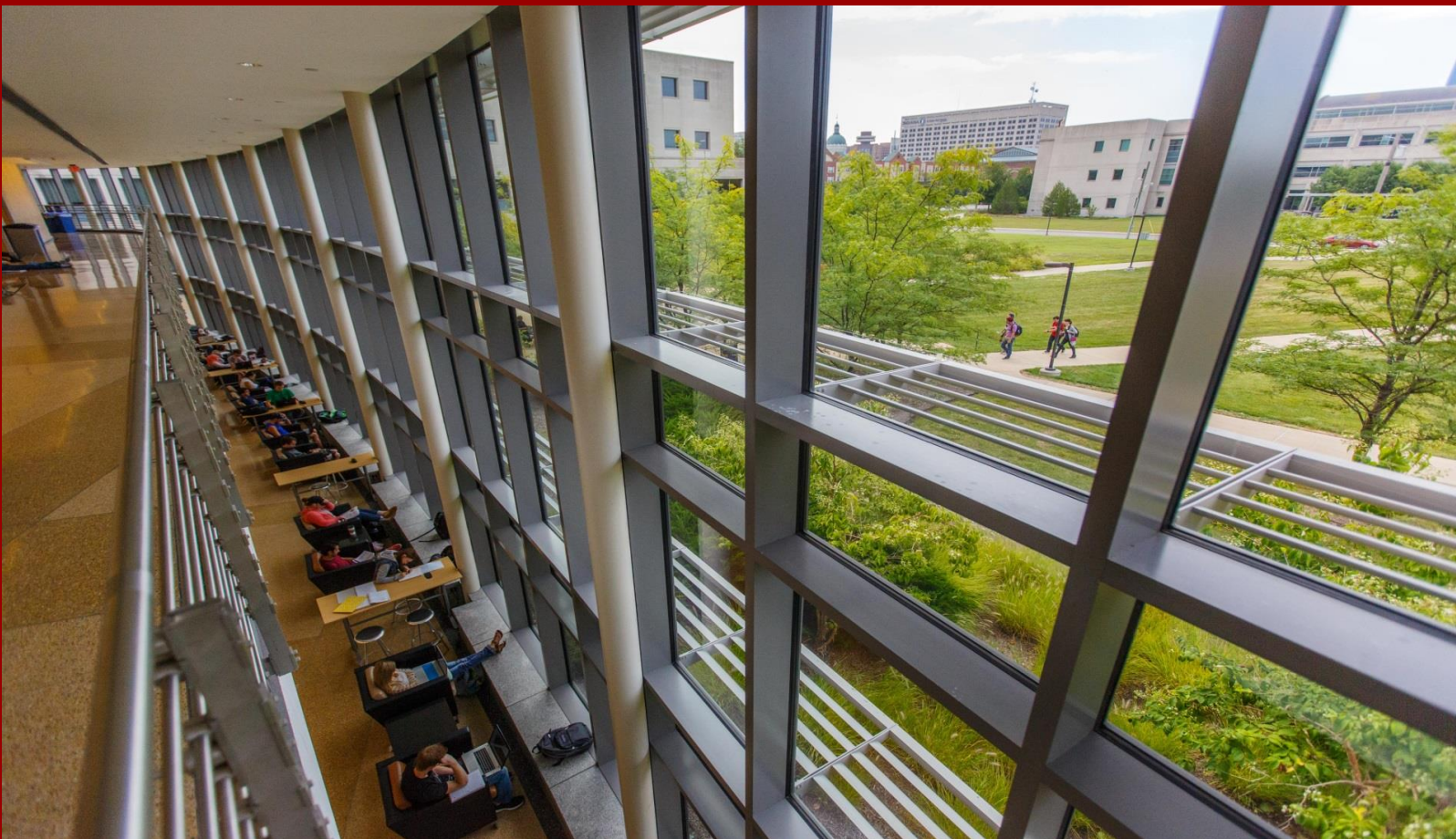

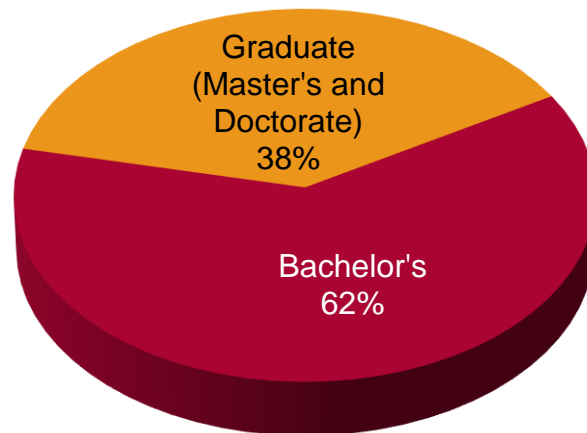

How committed are you to your current major?



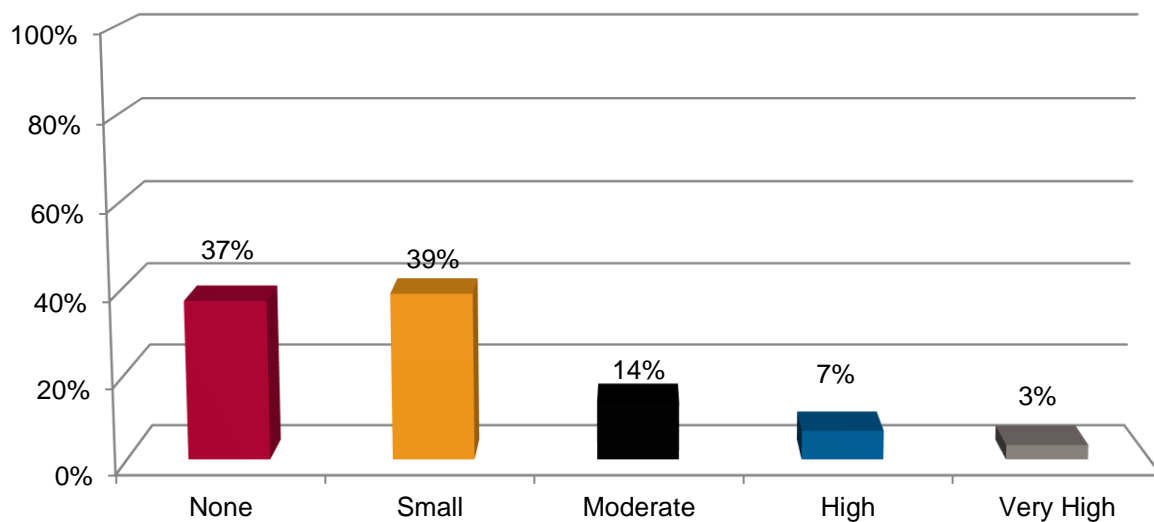
ACADEMIC FUTURE

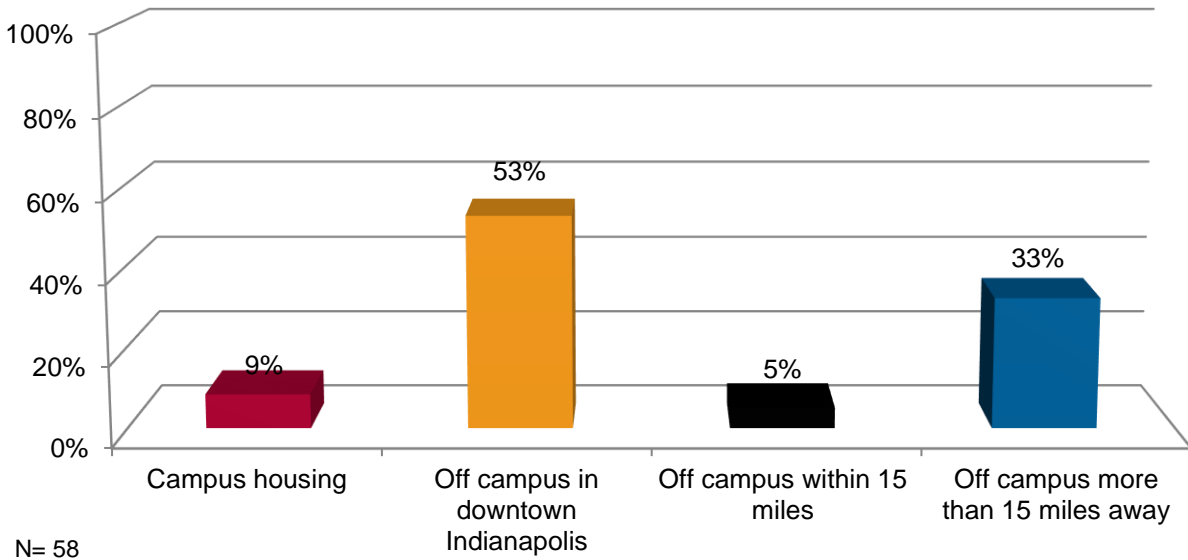
What is the likelihood that you will transfer from IUPUI to another college?



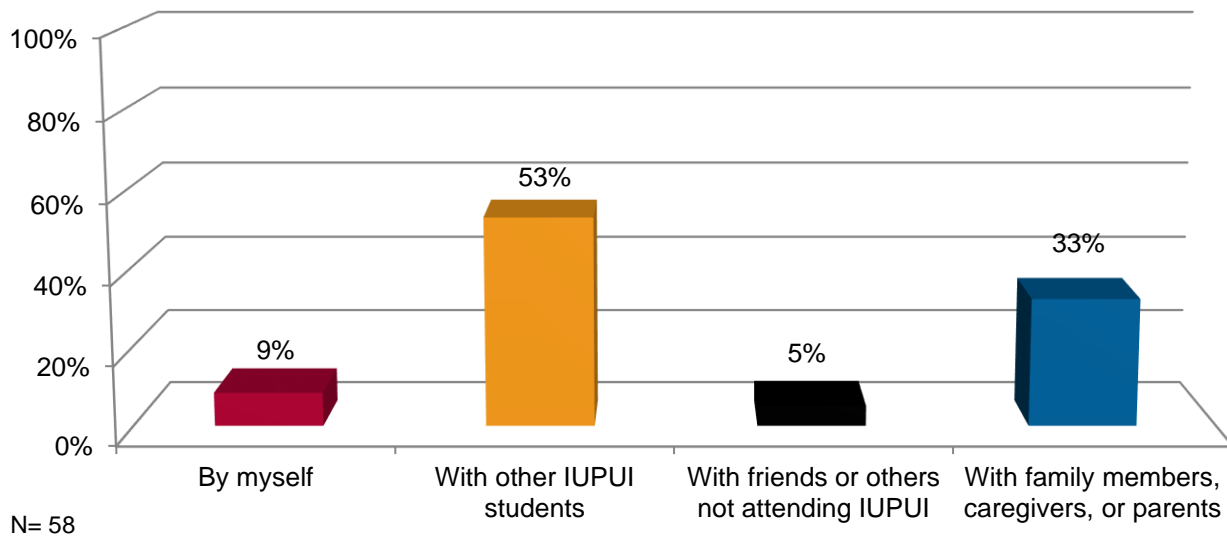
