## Welcome to the 2018 IUPUI Entering Student Survey Report

The Entering Student Survey is a yearly survey administered during New Student Orientation sessions. Students complete the online Qualtrics-based survey during a dedicated block of time to ensure they have enough time to complete the survey. The survey is voluntary and students are encouraged to complete it to ensure that we understand the support and resources they need to make successful transitions to IUPUI. Of the 1,539 transfer students in the 2018 cohort, 60 completed the Entering Student Survey. The response rate was 3.9%.

### Key Highlights Overall

- Overall transfer student respondents feel welcomed at IUPUI. About **87%** of students agree **‘the IUPUI campus community has made me feel welcomed.’**
- Slightly more than half of respondents (55%) strongly agree they are **‘proud to tell others I am going to school here.’**
- Respondents indicated high levels of Psychological Grit, with **91%** reporting high levels of being **hard working** and **68%** high levels of **‘I finish whatever I begin.’**
- **57%** of respondents reported having ‘some concerns’ about **financing their college education** while **56%** are ‘satisfied’ or ‘very satisfied’ with **the amount of financial support they have received so far.**
- **Less than half** of beginner respondents (31%) indicated that they plan to **prepare for class (studying, reading, writing, doing homework, etc.) more than 20 hours per week.** **44%** of students plan to **work for pay on-campus** while **76%** plan to **work for pay off-campus** during their first year.
- Transfer students rated their **‘ability to work with others that are different from you’** as the highest ability while **‘mathematical ability’** was the lowest.
- Top five reasons respondents reported choosing IUPUI were ‘Graduates get good jobs’, ‘Availability of specific academic programs,’ ‘Availability of financial aid/scholarship’, ‘Opportunity of an IU or Purdue Degree,’ and ‘Career and job opportunities available in Indianapolis after I complete my degree.’
- About **53%** of students felt there is a **‘Very good chance’ they will be satisfied with college life.’**
- Four of the top five factors students reported in choosing their major involve **their major being aligned with personal characteristics within themselves** such as their interests, skills and abilities, and personality.
- A majority of students (55%) **plan to obtain a Graduate degree (Master’s or Doctorate)** while 41% of respondents plan for a Bachelor’s degree to be the highest degree they obtain.

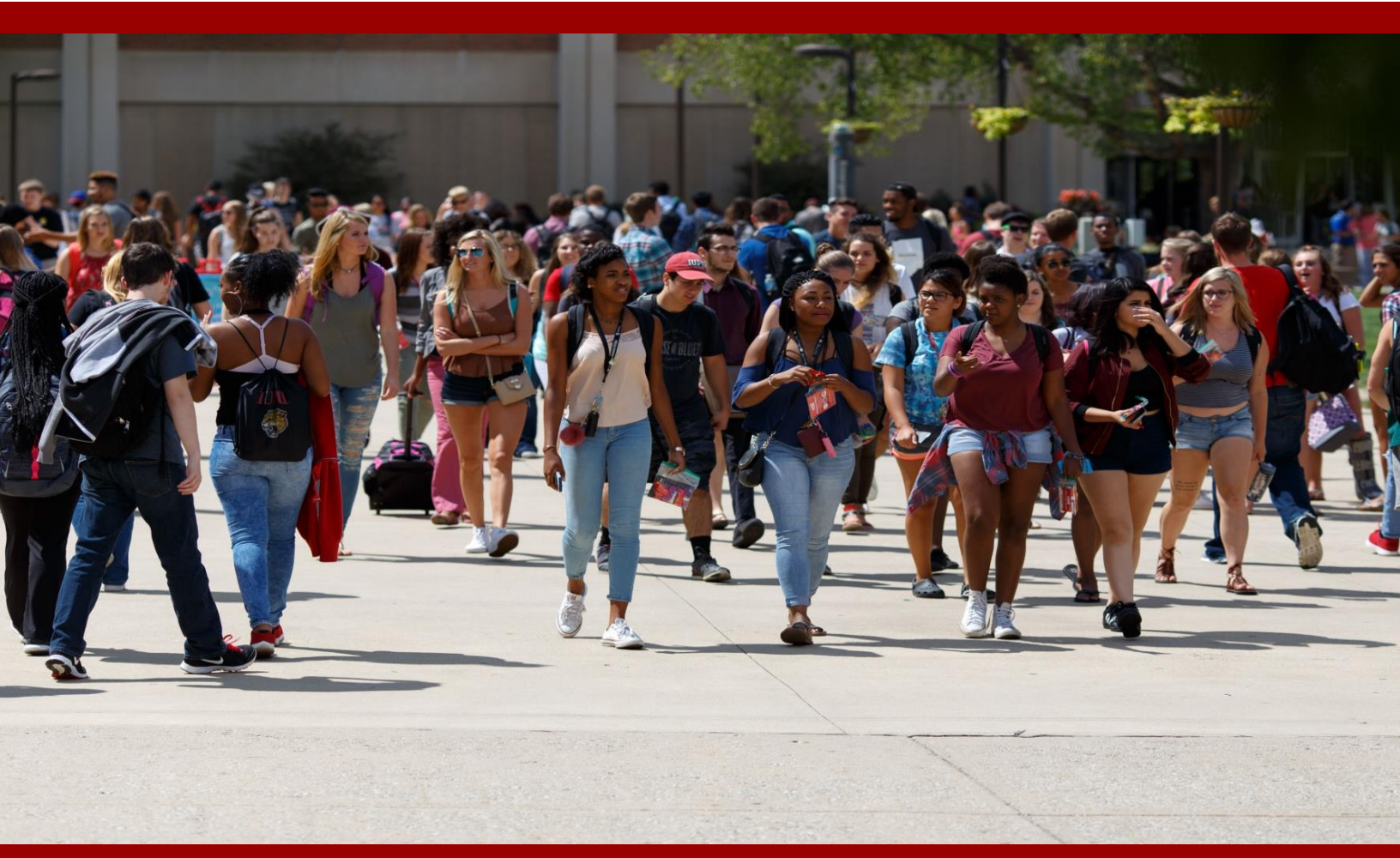

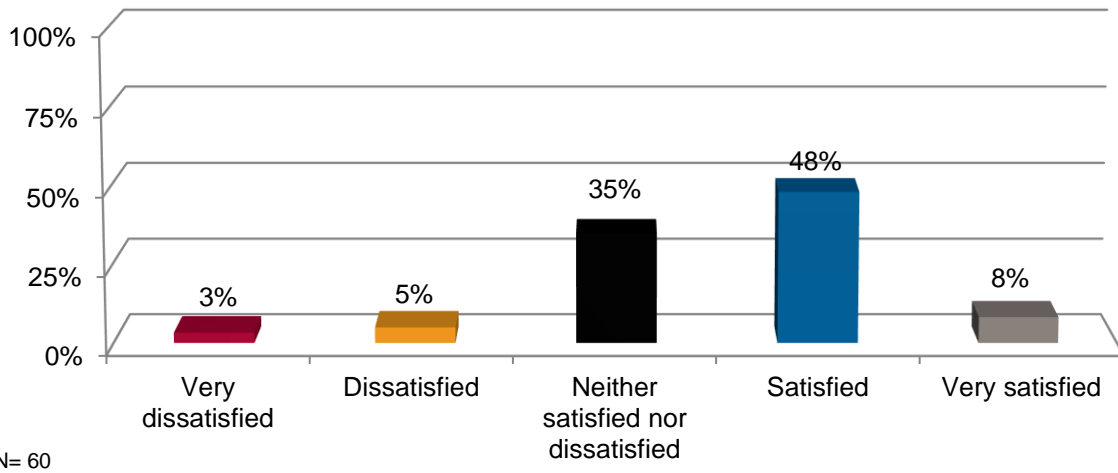

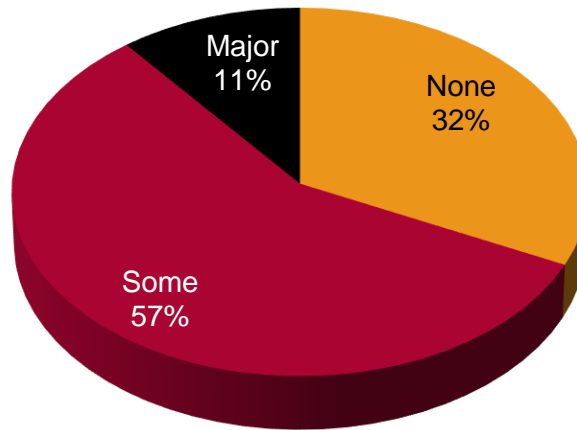

**Do you have any concerns about your ability to finance your college education?**



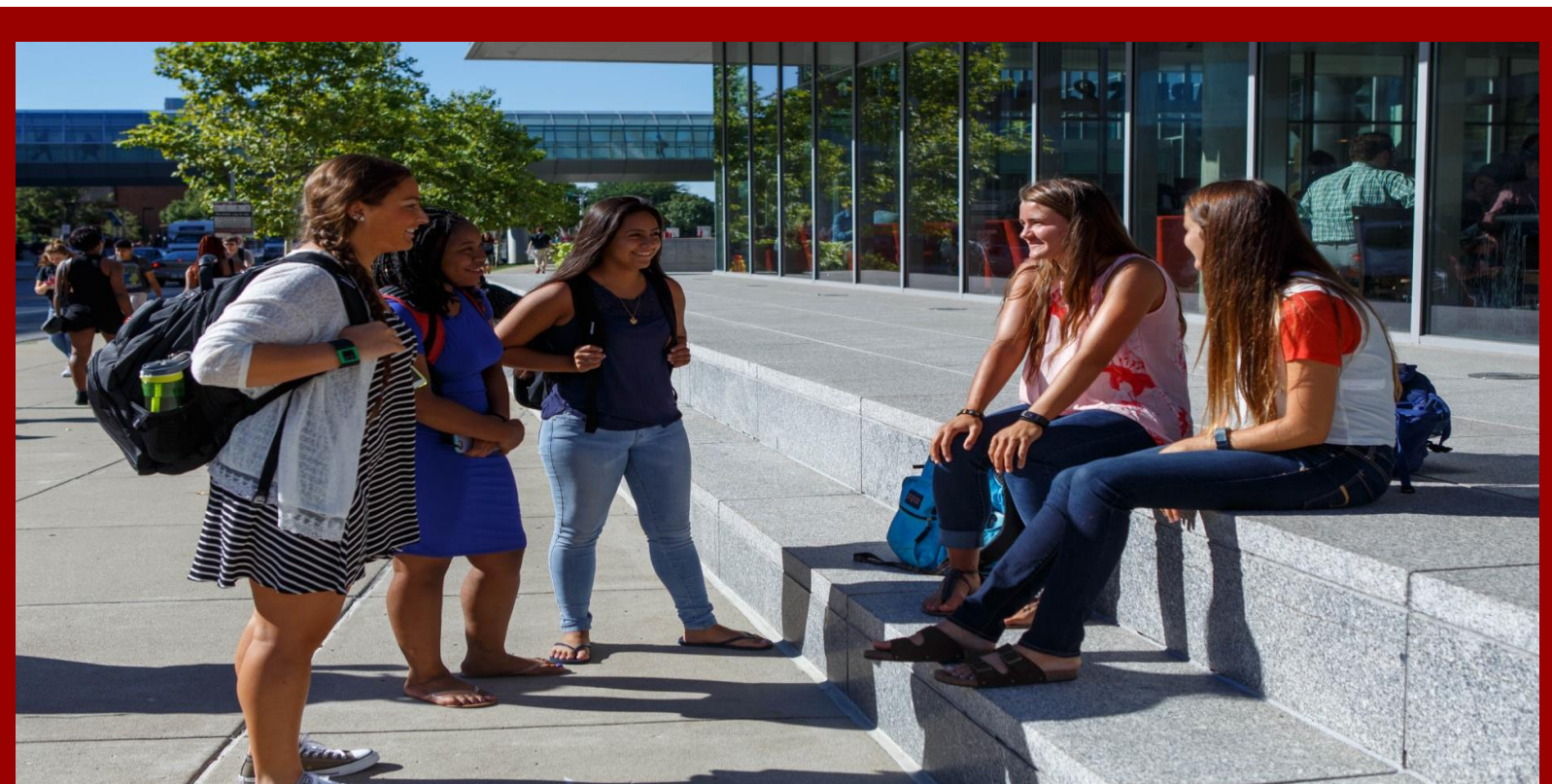

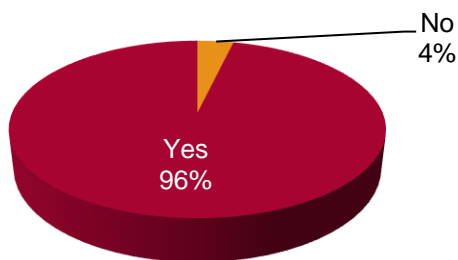

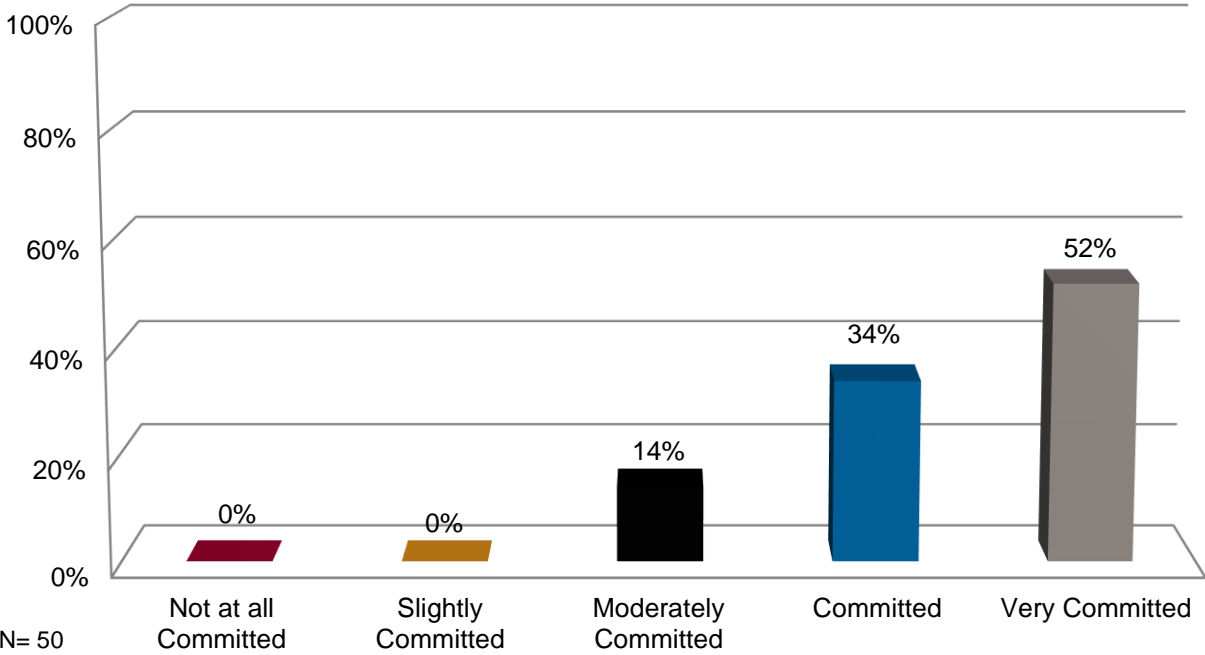

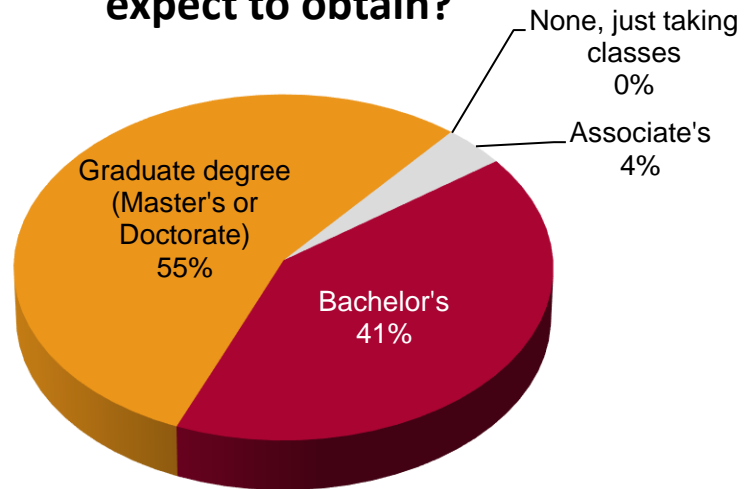


### How committed are you to your current major?



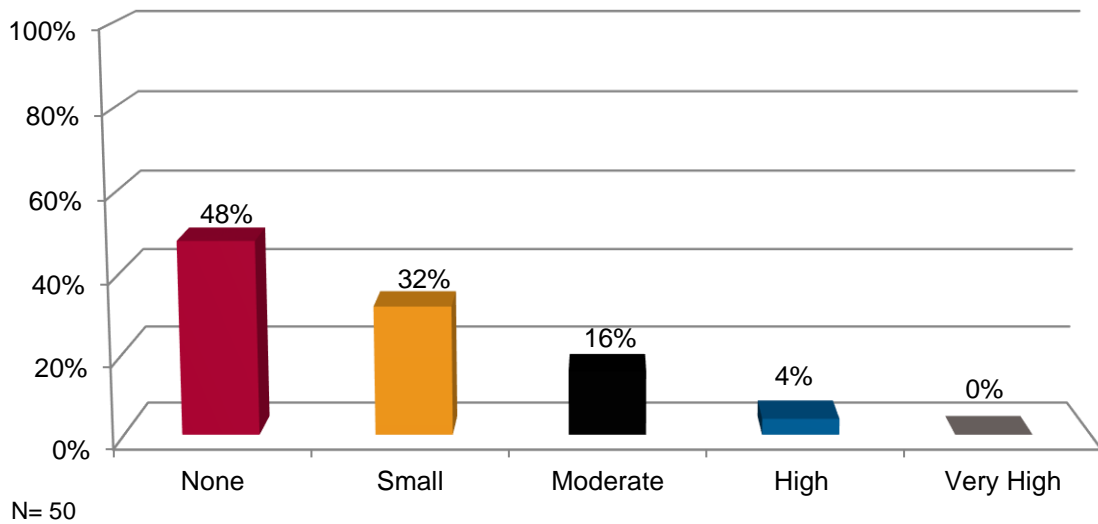
### ACADEMIC FUTURE

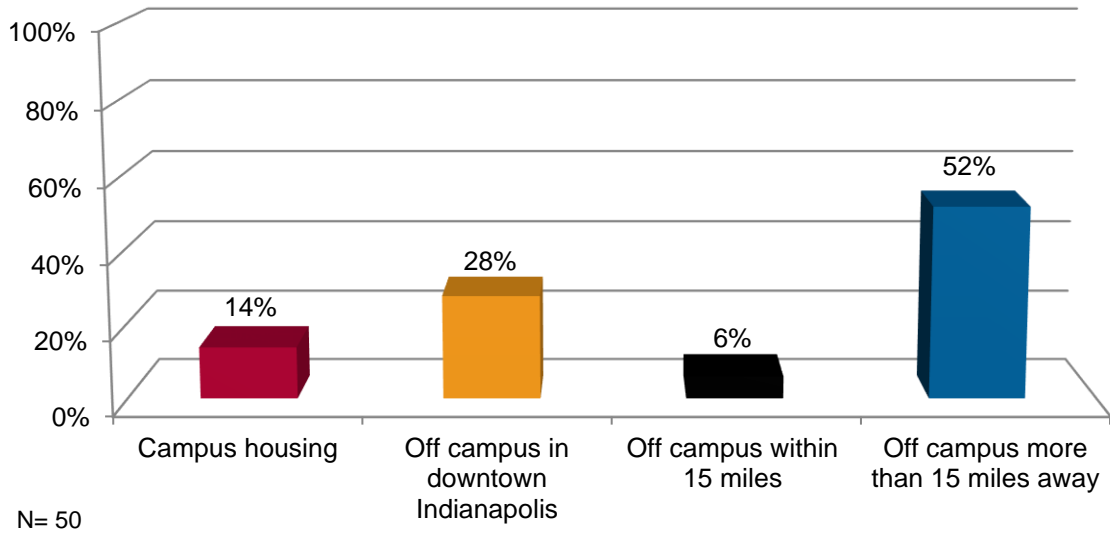
**What is the likelihood that you will transfer from IUPUI to another college?**



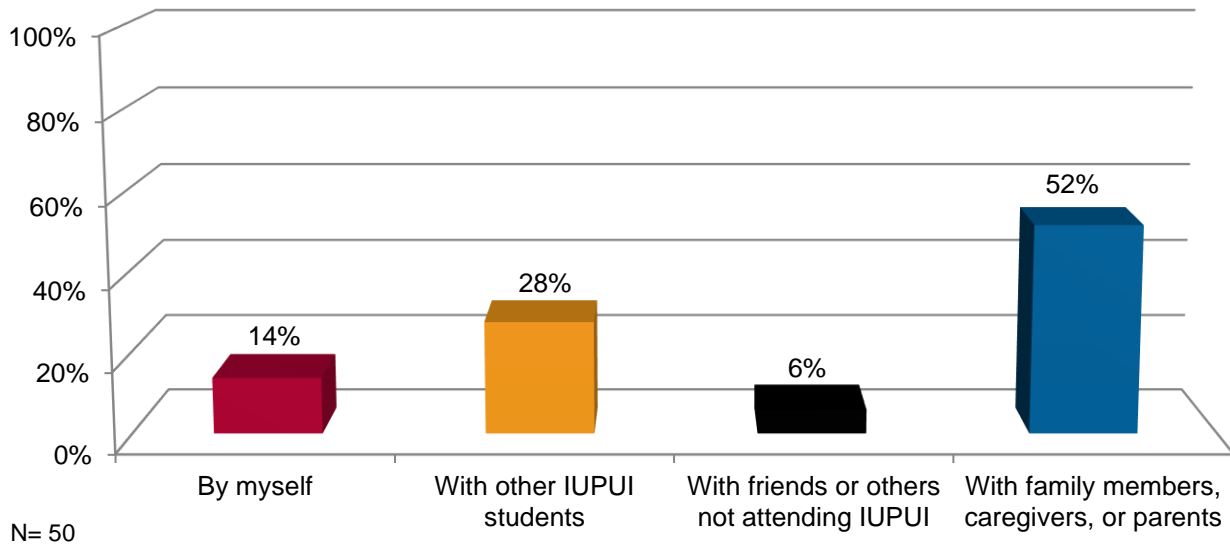
