COA Revisions

Net price amounts calculated in SFA will be used to populate the U.S. Department of Education's College Affordability and Transparency lists.

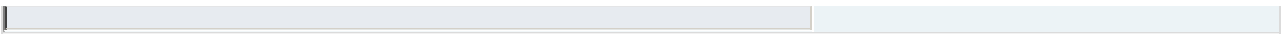
